

# The Areopagus Seminar Catalogue



The Areopagus\* is a Christian education ministry organization that provides seminars, workshops and forums on topics relevant to contemporary Christian life and education.

The mission of The Areopagus is to educate and equip Christians to understand their faith in more depth so they can engage others more effectively with the life-transforming truth and love of Jesus Christ. To this end, we offer a substantive curriculum that broadens and deepens their knowledge base, stimulates critical thinking, and challenges them to live faithfully and consistently in accord with the principles and practices of a wholistic Biblical Christian worldview.

Areopagus seminars and workshops are seminary-level courses that are offered at a nominal cost, and include a wide variety of topics in Biblical studies, Christian history, apologetics, comparative worldviews and religions, contemporary cultural issues, Christian spirituality, and literature and the arts. Most seminars are one-semester (18-hour) courses, but we also offer many short-term classes and lectures on various topics.

Through our seminars, forums, and other special events, The Areopagus provides a unique opportunity for Christians to come together in an interdenominational learning environment that is intellectually stimulating, socially engaging, and spiritually edifying.


<sup>\*</sup> In Christian history the name 'Areopagus' has often been used to represent the intersection of Christian faith and culture. In first century Athens the Areopagus functioned as a philosophical and cultural forum for the exchange of ideas, and it was there that the apostle Paul brought the gospel of Jesus Christ to Europe (ref. Acts 17:16ff).

# Seminar Curriculum

The Areopagus provides a systematic curriculum designed to broaden and deepen one's understanding of the historic Christian faith. These are substantive courses in terms of their content, but they are taught in an interactive and engaging manner that serious Christians find stimulating, inspiring and practical.


As the graphic below illustrates, the Areopagus seminar curriculum builds on a foundation of Biblical literacy with the goal of educating and equipping Christians to understand their faith in more depth and therefore share it more effectively with others. Most of our core courses are semester-length (12-weeks, 18-hours), and each includes supplementary readings and detailed outline notes. In addition, we also offer many short-term classes and lectures on various topics

Although there is a systematic and sequential order to these seminars, we offer these courses according to the priorities and preferences of our audience and host group. Cumulatively, this curriculum provides an in-depth treatment of Christian history and apologetics that is far broader than what is offered in most seminaries.

### An Introduction To Bibliology: What Every Christian Should Know About the Origins, Composition, Inspiration, Interpretation, Canonization, and Transmission of the Bible




Virtually everything Christians believe about metaphysical truth is derived either directly or inferentially from the Bible. But over the past 250 years the Bible has been subjected to intense criticism – not only by nonbelievers but often by scholars, theologians and ministers who profess to be Christians. This is why it is imperative that Christians understand not only *what* the Bible teaches but *why* we should trust it as an infallible guide for what we believe and how we live.

Based on Jefrey Breshears' book, *An Introduction To Bibliology*, the Areopagus seminar in Bibliology is an interactive study built around directed readings and focused discussions on 7 key topics related to the development of an informed and thoughtful philosophy of the Bible.




### **CHRISTIAN APOLOGETICS**



- 4. The God Who Is: The Case for Original Monotheism and the Classical and Contemporary Arguments for the Existence of God





# The Historical Quest for the Real Jesus: Reconciling the 'Jesus of History' and the 'Christ of Faith'



The question, "Who is Jesus?" is the central issue of the Christian faith. Until a couple of hundred years ago virtually no one challenged the historicity of Jesus, and few imagined any disjunction between the "Jesus of history" as presented in the New Testament and the "Christ of faith" that Christians worship as their spiritual Savior. But since then, these issues have become topics of major debates among Bible scholars, philosophers and theologians.

Much is at stake in this controversy including the historical reliability of the Bible, the validity of Christian preaching, teaching, and evangelism, and the inherent credibility of the Christian faith. This

makes it imperative that we understand why Christians have traditionally believed that Jesus Christ was the divine Savior of humanity – and why these claims are historically credible.


#### The Theodicy Issue: Reconciling the Realities of God and Evil

Christians believe that God is great and God is good, and yet evil and suffering are pervasive realities in this world. This is troubling because we assume that if God were truly great he would have the *power* to destroy evil and suffering in this world, and if God were truly good he would want to eradicate evil and suffering. So how do we reconcile the coexistence of God and evil?

This course examines the theodicy issue through 3 mediums – Biblical theology, philosophy, and the arts – and in the process we address issues including the sources of suffering; suffering as a pathway to grace and redemption; and questions such as: Is the problem of God and evil a good argument for atheism? and Why does God allow evil and suffering?

#### Frontline Apologetics: How To Explain and Defend the Christian Faith To Spiritual Seekers, Religious Skeptics, and Argumentative Contrarians

Many Christians are hesitant to share their faith because they feel unprepared to handle tough questions and challenges from spiritual seekers and religious skeptics (not to mention, questions by children!). This course covers a wide range of contemporary questions and issues that non-Christians raise, and equips Christians to handle these objections clearly, thoughtfully and effectively in a Christ-like spirit.



#### C. S. Lewis: The Life and Works of a 'Mere Christian'



# Satan's Bookshelf: The Worst Books Ever Written... and Why Christians Should Know Them!



# Part 1: The History and Philosophy of Cultural Marxism, and How It Has Impacted American Society and Culture







# Part 2: How Should We Now Live? The Challenges and Opportunities of Living in a 'Post-Christian' Society and Culture

A sequel to Part 1, this course is based on four recent books that provide a critical assessment of the current state of American culture, and how Christians can live faithfully and responsibly in the midst of a society that has become increasingly hostile toward Biblical beliefs and values. Ours is a society that celebrates materialism, hedonism, and self-indulgent narcissism, and one in which the forces of secularism are waging an aggressive spiritual and cultural war against morality and civility in general and the Christian faith in particular.









- (1) The problem: The challenges of living in a 'post-Christian' society and culture that is increasingly hostile toward Christian faith and values; and
- (2) The solution: The opportunities that the current situation affords in terms of rethinking our role and mission in society as a true spiritual counterculture.

#### **Writing Your Spiritual Autobiography**



### **GOD & THE ARTS**

The Areopagus is a unique Christian ministry in that we address not only issues related to Bibliology, history, apologetics, American culture and Christian spirituality, but also the arts. In particular, our seminars on "God & the Arts" focus on how the arts can supplement and inspire our spiritual growth and development. Therefore, the following presentations are designed not only to entertain and inform but also to stimulate critical thinking in the context of a wholistic Christian worldview.

#### The Jesus Movement Revisited

The history, the music and the legacy of the Jesus Movement of the late 1960s and early '70s, the last wide-spread spiritual renewal movement in American history that impacted the lives of hundreds of thousands of young adults.

#### Fallen Angel: The Life and Music of Larry Norman

Larry Norman was one of the originators of Christian rock and a prime driving force behind the Jesus Music of the 1970s. A gifted songwriter and a charismatic performer, he was also a troubled soul whose career and personal life were marred by controversy. With an intense desire for acceptance both as a Christian social prophet and a rock star, his fall from grace exemplified the pitfalls of aspiring Christian celebrities who struggle to be "in the world but not of it."

#### The Spiritual Odyssey of Pete Maravich



#### The Gospel According to Dylan




